This Transfer Guide can be used if you are interested in majoring in Special Education: Cognitive Impairment (K-12) with Teaching Grades PK-3, or Teaching Grades 3-6. Graduation requirements:

- ✓ A minimum of 60 semester hours from an accredited 4-year-degree granting institution.
- ✓ A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
- ✓ A minimum of 36 hours must be completed at the 300 level or above.
- ✓ A minimum of 120 credit hours.
- ✓ 6 credit hours must be "WI" Writing Intensive
- ✓ 3 credit hours must be "QR" Quantitative Reasoning

• The University Program Requirements and competencies, other than Writing Intensive competencies, may be fulfilled by students who satisfy the MTA (Michigan Transfer Agreement).

• Students are required to meet the following CMU Competency Requirements with a "C" or above prior to reaching 56 credit hours: two Written English (composition) courses, one Oral English (communication) course, and one Mathematics.

It is strongly recommended that transfer students contact CMU early in their college career to ensure proper course sequencing for their major, optimizing course scheduling, and timely degree completion at CMU.
