President's Report

President's Report to the Alpena Community Collee Board of Trustees December 19, 2024

Alpena Community College Hosts Iosco RESA Adult Education

ACC began hosting adult education beginning in Fall Semester 2024. Director Nichole Hatch is here tonight to talk about how this partnership is going and to also talk about IGNITE (Inmate Growth Naturally and Intentionally Through Education), a national initiative to help jails replicate a program created by Genesee County Sheriff Christopher Swanson. Alpena County Sheriff Erik Smith and Director Hatch recently announced they were bringing IGNITE to the Alpena County jail, the third county in Michigan to bring IGNITE to local inmates.

Strategic Planning and Budgeting Committee and Higher Learning Commission Accreditation Updates

Dr. Nick Brege, Vice President for Finance and Administration, and Dr. Paige Gordier, Vice President for Instruction, share leadership for the Strategic Planning and Budgeting Committee and both are also members of the Accreditation Steering Committee led by Dean of Workforce Development Dawn Stone. Dr. Brege and Dr. Gordier are here tonight to provide an update on the SPBC and accreditation. The 10-year re-accreditation cycle for ACC culminates in 2027.

Followings is a summary of Dr. Brege's report to the trustees:

Higher Learning Commission and Strategic Planning and Budgeting Update

In preparation for the Higher Learning Commission reaccreditation cycle and as part of the Strategic Planning and Budgeting Committee process, Alpena Community College employees have engaged in a dialogue to collectively examine strengths and opportunities for the College. Throughout the Fall 2024 semester, ACC employees have been actively participating in discussions to identify, prioritize, and improve key areas of the College's strategic plan.

As part of our annual start-up process, all College staff and faculty were introduced to the accreditation criteria and invited to join a criterion team of their choice. Each team brainstormed strategies to demonstrate proficiency in their assigned criterion and identified areas for improvement, reflecting HLC's emphasis on "continuous improvement."

A review of the session minutes revealed recurring themes, with communication being the most commonly highlighted area for growth.

To gather more insights, Dawn Stone distributed a staff survey to collect ideas and input on ways to enhance communication. While the responses varied widely, they provide valuable perspectives for committees and staff to consider moving forward.

One positive and unforeseen outcome of this initiative is an increased focus on clear and thorough communication across teams. For example:

- Additional newsletters and updates are now being shared with all staff.
- Committee discussions have increasingly prioritized raising awareness about campus events, activities, and other initiatives.

The SPBC has also embedded communication improvements into multiple focus areas. Additionally, an informal ad hoc committee has met to explore tactics for creating a shared, accessible, and user-friendly communication platform.

While progress has been made, work remains to identify a platform that effectively minimizes duplication of effort while meeting the needs of all users.

Alpena Community College Receives Consultation Education and Training (CET) Grant


Alpena Community College (ACC) is one of 18 nonprofit organizations and labor unions across Michigan receiving a state grant to improve workplace safety and health.

The awards through the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) will be used to develop and implement safety and health training programs for small and medium-sized employers and organizations.




Response Overview

1. How effective do you find the current communication channels (e.g., email, meetings, newsletters) used within the college?




2. What are the primary challenges you see with communication amongst colleagues, administrators, or students? (Choose all that apply)

Iosco RESA Adult Education Director Nicole Hatch spoke to the trustees about the history of the Adult Education program, how it came to be housed at ACC, and her experiences helping educate inmates at the Alpena County Jail.

Vice President of Administration and Finance Dr. Nick Brege addressed the Trustees and provided details in addition to his written report. He also pointed out the survey results included in the written President's Report which focused on communication within the College.

Vice President of Instruction Dr. Paige Gordier then spoke to the trustees about recent activities related to the ongoing Higher Learning Commission re-accreditation process. She said four groups had met throughout Fall Semester to identify evidence that could be used in the final report ACC will submit to the HLC. Gordier also noted how the Board of Trustees will be involved in the HLC process.

2.925 Bids: Installation of Six-Acre Solar Array

The following resolution was proposed by Trustee Townsend and seconded by Trustee Duncan:

The Alpena Community College Board of Trustees approves Harvest Solar of Jackson, Michigan, as solar contractor at a cost not to exceed \$3,381,345.

Financial Report

Monthly General Fund Revenue and Expense through November 2024 (Year-to-Year Actual Comparison)

- The property tax receipts of \$697,275 are \$32,159 more than those for November 2023.
- Tuition/fee receipts of \$6,183,421 are \$830,160 more than last year primarily due to an increase in the number of billable contact hours.
- State aid for the current year is \$1,412,580 and is \$35,275 more than November 2023.
- Interest is higher this year compared to last year because of the way the College invests its funds. We are now taking full advantage of the higher rates available through certificates and interest-bearing savings accounts.
- Instructional expenses are up due to contractual wage rate adjustments, the timing of hire for new faculty, and because there have been nine payrolls paid to date in the current fiscal year compared to eight for this time last year.

- Student Services is up primarily due to contractual wage rate adjustments, an additional payroll period, and athletic waivers.
- Institutional Administration is up primarily due to an additional payroll period this year compared to last year. Likewise, there is an increase in year-over-year insurance costs.
- Physical plant is up slightly compared to this time last year due to the timing of campus security contract payments and upgrades to building automation systems.
- Net income through the first five months of the year shows as a gain of \$1,290,678 which is typical for this time of year as spring tuition revenue is built up.

Monthly General Fund Revenue and Expense through November 2024 (Budget-to-Actual Comparison)

- Spending for supplies is on track for the current year. The current year budget for supplies expenses includes the cost of nursing supply packages, which was an unbudgeted expense last year.
- All other categories are in acceptable ranges for this stage of the year except as noted above.

General Fund Month-to-Month Comparison through November 2024

- Salaries and fringe benefits are higher due to having three payroll pay dates in November.
- Outside services reflects the Ellucian contract payment in the month of November.
- All other Month-to-Month comparisons are tracking as expected except as noted above.
