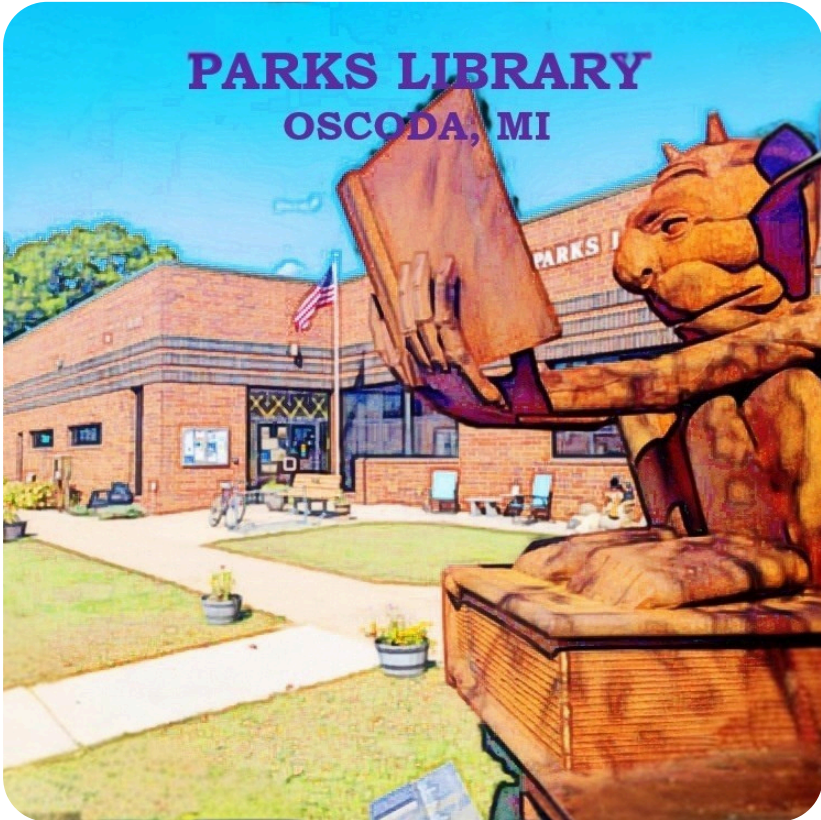

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• **What one/two/three things do you consider “most important” during an interview? On a resume?**

1. Proper attire (no pajamas, stained clothes or ripped clothes)
2. Be on time (or better yet a few minutes early)
3. Be honest. If you don't know how to answer a question, simply say that.

• **Is there ONE after high school/college class that you think is the MOST important?**

For me, it was my interpersonal communications class. Learning how to converse with someone (especially in this social media-rich time) is very important.

• **What does your business do/make/service provide?**

As a public library, we offer a plethora of services. We loan out books, DVDs, audiobooks, and magazines. We are able to borrow books from across the United States to share with our patrons, so if there is an obscure title you're interested in, we are likely able to get it for you. We also have a large bookstore in the large conference room in the back of the library, open 6 days a week. We provide public WIFI, we offer scanning services, faxing and copy services as well. We have free classes, lectures, presentations and programming most days of the week - anything from art group to birding classes.

• **Where are you located, and do you have more than one location?**

Right on the old air force base in Oscoda, across from ACC Oscoda campus.

• **What is the average starting wage for positions in your company?**

Depending on the location and demographic of the area, assistants start at minimum wage with the opportunity for annual raises. State certified librarians can make upwards of \$20 per hour or salary. Those who hold a BA or MA in Library Science have a competitive salary with public school teachers.

• **What types of skills do you think it's important for your employees to have?**

The ability to organize by alphabetical or numerical order, the ability to multitask, must possess strong customer service skills, have basic understanding of technology (computers, printers, fax machines, etc.) and employ research skills.

• **How many employees do you have?**

As a smaller rural library, we have 6 total employees. Larger libraries located in metropolises may have upwards of 15 employees.

• **Do you have any current job openings?**

We do not.

• **How can someone apply for a job at your company?**

Applications (when we are hiring) are available at Township Hall or the library. You can inquire with anyone at the circulation desk.
