ACC Awarded CET Grant

Alpena Community College recently received a CET (Consultation and Education Training) Grant in the amount of \$46,000. MIOSHA awards CET grants on an annual basis for the development and implementation of safety and health training and services to supplement CET division activities. The CET grant program was initiated as part of the MIOSHA effort to help assure a safe and healthful workplace. ACC's Grant of \$46,000 plus \$8,465 match funding will provide at least 1480 hours of training to local and regional business in the residential care, manufacturing, construction, and utility line clearance (tree trimming) industries.

Trainings available include workplace violence and ergonomics, OSHA 10, asbestos awareness, and specialized training for our utility line clearance workers.
