Course Withdrawal Deadlines: Individual Course Withdrawal (W Grade) is Friday, November 5. Complete Withdrawal (all courses W Grades) is Friday, December 10. For short courses (less than 16 weeks), please contact the Registrar's Office for drop/withdrawal dates.

Fall Graduation Applications are due to the Registrar's Office by **Friday, October 8**. Graduation applications are available in the Registrar's Office or on Self-Service.

The FAFSA for the 2022-2023 school year is available starting October 1, 2021.

Fall 2021 Semester Student Account Balance Checks will be available for pick-up from the cashier between 9am-2pm on the following date.
